

# Reaching Out To The Community

This tip sheet corresponds with Green Star and Air Quality Award Standard #6 – Reach Out to the Community About Your Green Star/Air Quality Efforts. ### **Provide Outreach and Education**

Getting the word out about what you’re doing is a great tool to increase awareness. Consider putting information about your Green Star or Air Quality activities in your newsletters, customer mailings, or invoices.

Displaying the Green Star and/or Air Quality logo in your workplace is one way to highlight your efforts and familiarize your customers with the program. Have you seen the Green Star logo on the side of People Mover buses? Now, that’s getting the word out!

A page on your web site detailing your Green Star or Air Quality efforts and a link to our web page also fits the bill when it comes to providing information and educating the public.

Green Star also can come to your workplace and give a presentation on recycling, air quality, energy efficiency or other topics. Green Star can provide written materials as well. Green Star also has an informational Air Quality display available for a few days or a few weeks at a time.

### **Participate in Green Star Activities**

Green Star offers numerous programs for the business community. Your employees or coworkers can get involved with several of these each year. Consider providing information about the events and programs, offering paid leave or time off to participate, and/or organizing groups at work to participate. Many of these activities make great teambuilding experiences.

- Green Star Board or Standards Committee  
Become a member of the board of directors or standards committee and get involved in the daily activities of Green Star.

- Green Events – Green Events provides recycling bins and often recruits volunteers for about 20 events throughout the year, including the Alaska State Fair and many others. Several of the events need individual and group volunteer assistance. Some organizations use Green Events as team building opportunities for employee groups. Contact Green Star to get on the email list for upcoming Green Events needing volunteers. Also consider making your next special event a Green Event by contacting Green Star about recycling bins and other waste preventing activities that can be incorporated.



- Bike to Work Day – This exciting, one-day event is held each spring and typically involves several thousand bicyclists. Ride your bike, organize a team, donate prizes for those who participate, or staff a refreshment station.



- Booths and Giveaways – Green Star occasionally staffs an information booth at events such as the Alaska Forum on the Environment, Earth Day activities and other events and conferences. In addition, Green Star periodically hosts timer giveaways for engine block heaters as part of its Air Quality program. Volunteer staffing is often needed for such events. Contact Green Star to determine when events are held.

- Clean-up Events – Anchorage offers numerous different cleanup opportunities such as Citywide Cleanup, Creek Cleanup, Scoop the Poop Day, Adopt-a-Stop, Adopt-a-Trail, and others. Or you can establish a litter-free zone at your organization. Post litter-free zone signs and organize a cleanup activity. 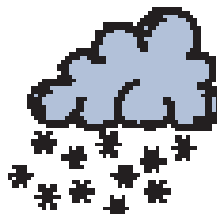

## Recruit New Members
